




Lexical sets

Why use lexical sets?

- Learning relies on language and access to a wide range of vocabulary
- □ Children need to learn social language (Basic Interpersonal Communication Skills BICS) and academic language (Cognitive Academic Language Proficiency CALP) (if you are interested in this area, read the work of Jim Cummins)
- Lexical sets are words associated with a subject e.g. the weather. Learning sets of words allows children to access aspects of a lesson
- ☐ These are valuable to ALL children in your class. They are valuable even if you do not have children with EAL in your class!

Using lexical sets (1)

- Pre-teaching vocabulary
- Lexical sets can be introduced using pre-teaching of vocabulary or resources can be produced to support children with engagement with the lesson
- □Slowly build up a bank of lexical sets, making them as colourful and visual as possible, so that children can utilise them without support where necessary
